

#### **Tony writes:**

Dear friends,

As I prepare to say "Good bye" to you all, a phrase of Jesus from the Fourth Gospel keeps coming into my head: "You are my friends if you do what I command you. No longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends." (John 15. 14-15)

I remember, when I was first ordained, one or two older priests saying that a priest shouldn't have particular friends from the parish, because that would be divisive. In one sense they were correct to advise against divisive friendships, but it is a different scenario altogether when you are able to call everyone friends. I call you all my friends. You will continue to be my friends even when I am not seeing you on a regular basis and I treasure your friendship. We have supported one another through happy times and sad times and rejoiced in one anothers' company. Thank you for your friendship.

Another picture which comes to mind is St.Paul's metaphor of the body with its many parts. In his First Letter to the church in Corinth, Chapter 12, he talks about the variety of gifts which are given to us by the Holy Spirit of God and concludes that we need one another, just as the body needs all its parts. As your Rector for the last 22 years, I am just the tip of the iceberg, whose ministry is more visible, because I wear a collar and I am paid to do it full time! Just as important are all the many ministries which you all engage in, even when you are not aware that it is a ministry. Whether it be administration or music, cleaning or organising, serving refreshments or raising money, caring for those in need or looking after the buildings; whatever your ministry is, thank you for your time, energy and financial support. Without all of you, there would be no church and I wouldn't be able to do what I do. St. Paul, in describing the many gifts and ministries which belong to the Body of Christ, concludes by underlining the primacy of love. Without love, we are nothing., he says. All of our ministry is empty and in vain unless it is done in love. We don't minister to make ourselves feel better, but rather out of love for God and love for our fellow human beings.

The final phrase, which comes into my mind, is Jesus' response to the two brothers, James and John, asking for the privilege of sitting either side of Jesus when he enters into his kingdom and to the other disciples' indignation. It's not about glory or power, he tells them, but about service:

"Whoever would be great among you must be your servant and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve." (Mark 10 43-45)

Jesus turns the world of power and ambition and worldly success on its head. I was heartened by our new Prime Minister, when he pledged to restore the spirit of service into politics. That should especially be true in the church. We may have to put aside what we want, in order to encourage others. We may have to give others the chance to express themselves, even if they do it in a different way to us. Above all, we offer ourselves, as the post-communion prayer puts it:

"We offer ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory."

Not for nothing is what we do together in Church referred to as a "service" The service of our worship prepares us for the service of our lives.

So thank you for your friendship. Thank you for the gifts which are uniquely yours and which you share abundantly with us. Above all, thank you for your love, which shows itself in service.

God bless you all.



Lesley Smith, Curator of Tutbury Castle is famed for her colourful costumed presentations and she now presents Katherine of Aragon.

Katherine of Aragon was born into one of the most powerful and warlike families in Europe. She was the youngest of five children who had for royal parents King Ferdinand II of Aragon and Oueen Isabella I of Castille. Many in her family died young and madness stalked each generation.

Katherine arrived in England to marry Arthur, Prince of Wales, of the new Tudor dynasty but within months of the marriage, he was dead, and she was effectively abandoned for six years with little money and poor care.

When the glittering young Henry VIII leapt upon the throne of England he married Katherine and she became Queen. After a very happy start to the marriage they went on to suffer a series of miscarriages. Their son died within weeks of his birth but their daughter, Mary, would become Queen Mary 1st.

#### **Lighting of D-Day Beacon**

Thursday 6th June was the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings. That evening a beacon was lit on the tower roof of St Bartholomew's Church Elvaston. The brazier used is beautiful, it has the



names of the beaches and cut out silhouettes of soldiers. This was initiated by the Elvaston Parish Council and grateful thanks are given to members of the council who carried the brazier and the gas canister up the 108 tower steps which is no mean feat!

I was greatly honoured to be asked to light the brazier and at 9.20pm on a perfect evening the beacon was lit. It was a very moving moment thinking of the heroism and self sacrifice that took place that day 80 years ago.



#### **Buildings Update**

By the time On Stream goes to print, our programme of building works should be almost finished, and the scaffolding removed. The new tower roof is now keeping the tower warm, dry and safe. The wooden framework (probably Victorian), which was in extremely poor condition, has been replaced and it should now be a very long time before similar work is necessary again. The louvres on the tower windows have all been repaired or replaced, deterring nesting birds from making a mess. Guttering and downpipes on the south side of the church have been renewed, ensuring the roof and walls are kept dry and free of any damp. Finally some decorating work has been carried out on the interior of the church.

All of this work has significantly drained our reserves, so we will be actively fundraising in the coming months. Starting with our "Tea and Cakes by the River" event on 25<sup>th</sup> August – we hope to see you there!


