

Tony writes:



Dear friends,

There seems to be a lot of suffering in the world at the moment. When we see the suffering of innocent people in Gaza and the Ukraine, we are perhaps among the many who ask, "Where is God in all this?"

There are no glib answers, but for me, I have to keep coming back to the cry of Jesus on the cross on that first Good Friday:

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

It is a cry which is echoed again and again by people in the face of pain and suffering, either their own or that of their loved ones: "Why God? Where are you? Why have you forsaken us?" Jesus, on the cross, invites us to believe in a God who suffers with us and for us, rather than a God who is distant and removed from our situation. We are not like pieces on a chessboard being moved about in some crazy game by an unfeeling God, but rather God is with us and suffers with us. Can we believe that? Can we believe that our tears are God's tears, our pains are God's pains, just as our joys are God's joys also? Isn't that the truth which Jesus shows us? Isn't that something of what the cross is all about?

Every year in Holy Week and Easter we celebrate the drama of a God who goes with us the whole way. Jesus shows us the truth of "God with us." He reveals a God who weeps at his friend Lazarus' tomb, who shares our loneliness and fears in Gethsemane, who is taunted and despised and spat upon, who is abused and tortured and faces a horrific death. Jesus shows us a God who goes the whole way, right into the jaws of death and who holds out the Easter promise of new and eternal life in his presence. Suffering and death will not have the last say.

The joy of Easter comes from the knowledge that God is with us and life will prevail. God journeys with us and shares all that life may throw in our direction and we are one with God, sharing the blessings of life which come from living in God's presence. God comes with us to the tomb and opens the door to eternity. He is there at the daybreak and the evening of our lives. He is also the sunrise and the morning of a new day.

May you know that God is with you this Easter and always.



HISTORIC CHURCH COLLECTION.

Do you realise that one of the biggest disasters at sea, of all time, occurred 112 years ago this month, on 15/4/12, and people still talk about it to this day? After hitting an iceberg the "unsinkable" ship, the Titanic, sank on it's maiden voyage, with massive loss of lives. The shocking news soon spread around the world and a Titanic Disaster Fund was set up. This was to help the survivors, the family's of the people that




