Tony writes:



Dear friends,

Family history has become something of a growth industry in our modern age. Perhaps it is because the internet has created new possibilities for access to records and exchange of information about family trees, to which the popularity of websites, such as Ancestry.com, testifies. Perhaps too there is a deep-seated need, in the face of the fragmented society in which we live, to put down roots and have a sense of where we belong. Whatever it is, there seems to be something immensely satisfying to most people to discover information or, even better, photographs about their forbears. Consider for a moment the lengths that some people, who were adopted as young babies, often go to in order to discover their natural parents, even if the consequences do not turn out to be the anticipated joyful reunion. We want to know where we have come from.

Another example of a similar sentiment is family photographs. One tip I learnt as a young curate was, when visiting people, especially the elderly, always look at the family photos. They are always a source of pride and a good conversation starter, because people nearly always want to tell you about their family; who's who and who's doing what and where! It is fascinating to note how people who live on their own surround themselves with photographs of departed loved ones as well as very much alive grandchildren or nieces and nephews. It is almost as though they are there to remind the person that they really are not alone; they are surrounded by the love and affection of all these people who are in turn special to them.

November always seems to me a time for family photos and family trees. Everyone knows about the great festivals of Christmas and Easter, but sadly in our modern age some of the other festivals get overlooked. All Saints' Day is one of these and yet it is a significant moment in the year when we remember our spiritual family tree. We can use this time to remind ourselves that we are not alone as Christians but part of a

family of faith, a family which is both catholic and apostolic, in other words, which extends throughout the world and throughout history. Together with those who have gone before us in faith and those who share the faith with us today, we are all saints.

The following day at All Souls' and just over a week later at Remembrance Sunday we remember our private and national unity with those who are dear to us but whom we see no longer. It is like getting the family album out, surrounding ourselves with the memories they represent and standing with them in the eternal presence of God.

As the unknown writer of the Letter to the Hebrews says:

"Since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us." They are cheering us on from the grandstand!






